
HISTORIC TOWN OF BANSKÁ ŠTIAVNICA AND THE TECHNICAL MONUMENTS IN ITS VINICITY

- O Over the centuries, the town of Banská Štiavnica was visited by many outstanding engineers and scientists who contributed to its fame.
- O The urban centre blends into the surrounding landscape, which contains vital relics of the mining and metallurgical activities of the past.
- O Banská Štiavnica is the oldest mining town in Slovakia, was established in the 13th century



VILLAGE VLKOLÍNEC

- O This extraordinary and remarkable oasis of folk architecture was included in the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1993.
- O The community was first referred to in 1376.
- O Original folk buildings remain untouched by modern construction. Based in comparative study of ICOMOS (International Council for Monuments and Settlements) it was classified as the best-reserved settlement of this time within the Carpathian Arch.
- O Originally it was the settlement of loggers, shepherds and farmers.

FUJARA – MUSICAL INSTRUMENT AND ITS MUSIC

- O Fujara is a beautiful musical instrument of folk culture, also referred to as "the queen among folk instruments"
- O It can be found only in Slovakia, particularly in its central part, and is one of our national symbols since the 18th century
- O It is a long wooden pipe with three tactual holes. It is decorated by various ornaments



MUSIC OF TERCHOVÁ

- O Music of Terchová is a musical culture which is passed on to other generations by oral tradition
- O It originated in the Terchová village and its surroundings
- O The Music of Terchová is characterized by a 3 – 4 member string cast and a small two-string double bass
